

Tips for a safe visit to the Cape Town CBD



STASH BEFORE YOU DASH


- Don't leave valuables in your vehicle in full view of passers-by.
- If you need to leave your belongings in your vehicle, be vigilant when you stash them in the cubby hole or boot.
- Preferably, lock valuable items in the boot before you start your trip.



. HOLD TIGHT, OUT OF SIGHT

- Don't walk with your cell phone in your hand, keep it out of sight.
- If you need to use your cell phone, step into a nearby shop, restaurant or building foyer.
- Don't flash your jewellery, especially gold chains, to avoid chain-snatching.
- Hold your bag tightly and ensure it is zipped up or closed.
- Don't leave your wallet or cell phone unattended on a restaurant table.

- Don't fall prey to remote jamming, a technique used to interfere with your vehicle's locking system.
- Always lock your vehicle's doors and manually check them before you walk away.
- Stay vigilant when approaching and leaving your vehicle.



BE WISE, STAY SAFE

- You do NOT need a permit to walk in the Cape Town CBD! If you're asked to "buy" a permit, you're being scammed. Don't hand over your bank card or punch your PIN into any handheld keypad (like a calculator) or building entrance keypad. It's a scam!
- Don't let a stranger lead/accompany you to an ATM for any reason. If you need to draw money, ensure that no one can see your PIN.
- · Don't allow anyone to distract you at an ATM.
