Local and Global Leadership Approaches to Brain Health Equity

Hear from recognized <u>pioneer</u> of geriatrics in Mexico, <u>Luis Miguel Gutiérrez-Robledo</u>, who created the National Institute of Geriatrics, recognized by decree of the President of the United Mexican States in May 2012.
